New World Order: WMJR Moves To Google Groups For Email

Ever since our club first started using email as our primary means of electronic communication we have relied on the generous services of team.net, a car lovers web site run pro bono by Salt Lake City's own Mark Bradakis.

Wonderful as this has been, it's time now to move to more modern technology such as groups.google.com

This offers many advantages, including:

- A web interface rather than simply individual messages in our mailboxes
- Archiving of old messages so that newcomers can catch up easily
- Search functions on messages
- Ability to use attachments such as photos in messages
- Support for a multitude of client devices such as smart phones
- All the resources of web giant Google to maximize availability, uptime, and ease of access worldwide
- Individuals can customize their Google profiles by adding signature photos called "avatars" check out mine!

And, still the same price to the club — free!

However, in return for all this Google requires a few steps on our part, mainly to authenticate users and defend against misuse by spammers and advertisers.

Park City Classic Car Show Saturday July 26

Any classic sports car built before 1989 may enter. Entrants will receive a dash plaque, two ballots, and two raffle tickets.

Automotive clubs are encouraged to promote their respective marque.

Judging for trophies will be performed by the entrants. People's Choice award will be chosen by both entrants and the general public.

Class awards are based only on make of vehicle, i.e. Jaguar, MG, Austin Healey, etc.

The number of class awards will be determined by the number of entrants by June 15, 2014.

A First in Class award will be given if there are five entries of the same manufacture. A class award will be given for each additional three entries, with a maximum of three awards per class.

A raffle will be held during the show time. Donations for the raffle are greatly appreciated. Raffle tickets will be available for purchase during the show.

Ballots and awards will only reflect the entries received before June 16th. All entries are eligible for awards.


The reserved area will allow only

60 entries

Clubs may elect to hold their own style of judging in conjunction with the show (concours, etc.) and will be allowed time at the conclusion to present their own results.

Cars must be in place by 10am. Display vehicles will be parked diagonally on both sides of Main Street facing downhill. They will be spaced 5 feet apart, and there will be a 20 foot clear section in the middle for safety reasons.

The street must be cleared and open for traffic by 2:30pm. You can park in a designated parking stall and pay the parking fee after that time.

Jaguar Designs Tour de France Bicycle — from www.autoblog.com

Jaguar is known for designing luxury sedans, and it's known for designing GTs. But once in a while it dabbles in a new area of transportation design. It's working on its first crossover at the moment, and even did a speedboat concept a couple of years ago. Now it's turned its attention to bicycles.

While many automakers have designed bikes in the past, Jaguar's project has a

bit more of a direct correlation. It's been working with Team Sky – the outfit that has won the Tour de France two years running now – since 2010, furnishing the team with support vehicles for bicycle races around the world. But now it's step-


ping its collaboration up a notch by redesigning the team's bike.

Working with frame manufacturer Pinarello, Jaguar took the existing Dogma 65.1 racing bike design back to the drawing board. Jaguar's designers and engineers reshaped the frame tubes, seat post, front fork, derailleur and all the components attached to the frame, each part streamlined for aerodynamic efficiency. They ran it through Jaguar's Computational Fluid Dynamics processor 300 times then verified the results in the wind tunnel.

The resulting Pinarello Dogma F8 is an impres-

sive 26.1 percent more aerodynamic than the 65.1. Which couldn't have been an easy feat to accomplish, but ought to put Team Sky in an even better position to defend its title this season. Scope out the details and the video by following this link.
