Camp Floyd was the encampment of Johnson's Army, sent out to protect the overland stage and Pony Express routes, as well as keep an eye on Brother Brigham and his followers.

The latter had the last laugh on the Army as the Mormons profited nicely from selling supplies to the Army and reaping a windfall when the troops had to hasten back east for the start of the Civil War. This required a hasty auction where \$4 million in supplies were auctioned for only \$100k. In many ways this army "invasion" was the best thing that ever happened to Brigham & Co.

All in all it was an entertaining and invigorating tour on delightful rarely traveled roads. More than one participant remarked "We really need to do this more often!"




