Teslas, Get Out Your Extension Cords: Here Comes The Rimac C_Two

Supercar enthusiasts have a lot of reasons to get excited about automakers embracing electrification as plenty of zero-emissions machines have been announced with staggering technical specifications.

Case in point, Rimac unveiled the C Two nearly a year ago in Geneva and now they're about to show the bonkers electric hypercar with a fresh new of coat paint.

Dressed in Arctic White with exquisite deep blue-tinted carbon fiber body elements, the C-Two for the 2019 Geneva Motor Show represents Rimac's way of telling us everything is going according to the plan.

Prototypes of the electric beast are already in production, and the Croatian marque hints at powertrain improvements set to be implemented in the customer-spec production cars due in 2020.

The showcar's interior cabin is also a sight to behold thanks to a matte carbon fiber theme combined with petroleum blue for the leather noticeable on the seats, door cards, steering

electric motors with a combined output of 1,914 horse-power and an instant torque of 2,300 Newton-meters (1,696 pound-feet).

It's enough electric punch for a sprint to 60 mph (96 kph) in precisely 1.85 seconds, with the 0-186 mph (0-300 kph) taking just 11.8 seconds.
