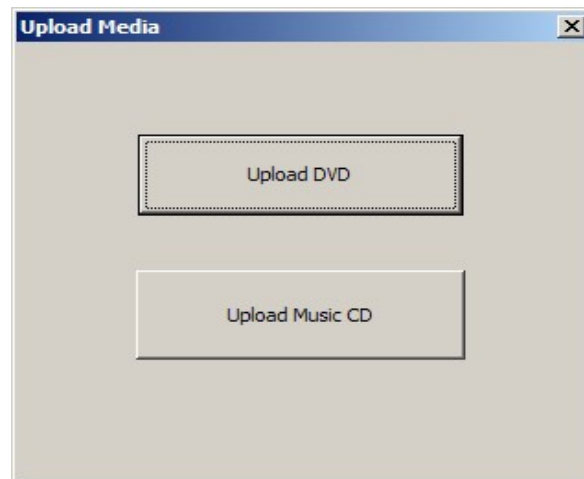




How to upload DVD

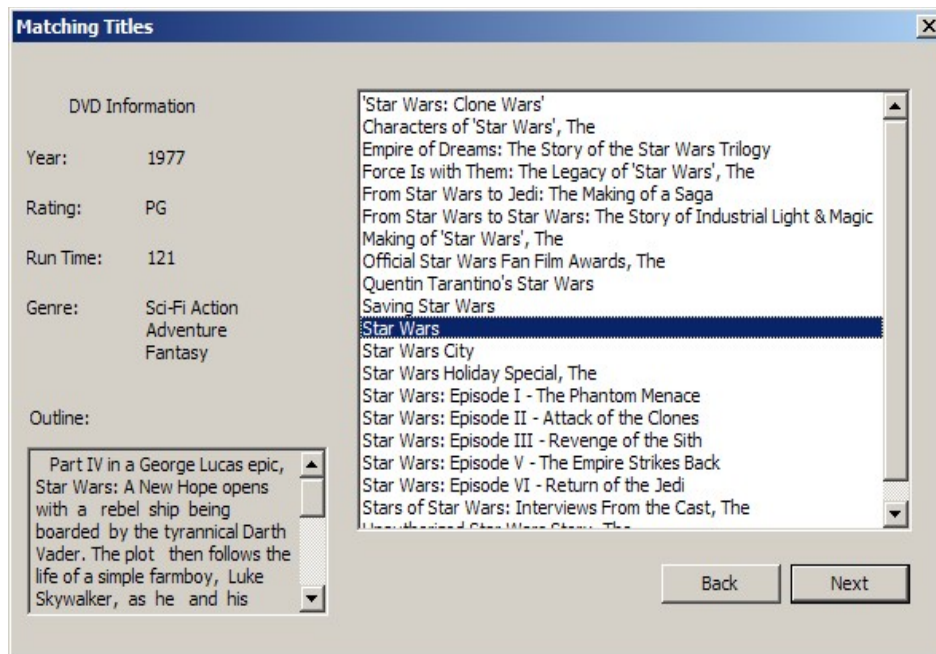
1. Insert the DVD you want to load into the system and start the LoadMedia application. (If the movie starts playing cancel it)
2. When Load Media starts, the "Upload Media" window will be displayed. Select the Upload DVD option on this window.



3. After selecting upload DVD the "DVD Information" window will be displayed. Type in a title and year(optional) for the movie you want to load and click next. If you are trying to load "The Official Star Wars Fan Film Awards" simply type in "Star Wars" and the program will search for all movies with Star Wars in the title. To narrow down the search you can Type in the complete title and year. If there is no movie information available you can click on 'Add Manually.'

4. A listing of all movies matching the criteria entered on the previous window is displayed. When clicking on a movie title in the listing, information about that selection is presented on the left side of the window. Look for the movie that matches the one you want to load into the system. If there is no exact match, pick the closest match and you can alter the information in the next window. You can select a match by clicking on the title followed by the next button or double clicking on the title name.



5. A list of the movie attributes will be displayed. You can alter the attributes if wanted. For example, if you want a movie that is rated pg-13 to appear as R in the system you can change the setting. When using this window the following information is important to know:
- Title - can be changed to any value
 - Year - must be entered in the format yyyy
 - Directors - enter multiple names but each must be followed by hitting the enter key
 - Genres - can select or unselect multiple genres by clicking on the genre once. The selected genres are highlighted.
 - Writers - enter multiple writers by typing the name followed by enter key
 - Producer - can enter only one producer
 - Rating - select one rating by picking from the drop down box
 - Running Time - enter number
 - IMDB User Rating - can only enter number between 1.0 to 10.0
 - Summary - enter anything you want

6. It is now time to encode the movie and load it into the system.

- Video Codec - format that you want to convert to
- Track - the track on the DVD that you want to encode. If you are not sure about the track just enter 1 and it will usually work to encode the whole movie.
- Chapter - (optional) If you want to select just one chapter to encode enter the chapter number. If you want to encode chapters 2 through 4 enter it with the format 2-4.
- The seconds category is also optional. If you want to encode the first 2 minutes of the movie then type 120 in the seconds box.
